200 MARCHED May Day Banners

LED BY ANARCHIST WITH bannerettes flaunting, 200

WITH bannerettes flaunting. 200 May Day enthusiasts marched through the city yesterday in cele-bration of the Internation Labor Day The only new slogan to make its appearance was the banner: Hands Off Chima The procession which was headed by the Trades Hall Band, inc uded two decorated loriss bearing the May Day Queen and her court of a number of children dressed in white and red. South Melbourne Band headed a body of members of the LW W. Some distance ahead of the oro-cession, but apparently quite dis-tinct from it, was Mr. John Flem-ing, the Yarra Bank orator, with a bodyguard of one. They carried a hanner bear-ing the words: Anarchy, No God. Freedom, No King, No Parliament.

Parliament. Apparently these principles did not meet with the approval of the May Day enthusiasts, as the pro-cession was ha'ted for some time in the city while an attempt was made to induce Mr Fleming and his companion to retire to the rear of the procession. He would not do so, however, but marched on.
