

Proposed Labour Club & Institute.

AT the final meeting of the Committee which organized the Labour Demonstration in Leicester on May 7th, it was unanimously agreed that it was desirable to endeavour to bring together and maintain in Association, a body of friends of Labour who would continue and extend the work of **Education, Agitation and Organization** which was so successfully commenced on May 7th.

In order that a common centre for such work might be provided, and that all interested in, and willing to work for the **Emancipation of Labour** might co-operate, it was unanimously agreed to hold a **Meeting on Tuesday, May 30th**, at 8 p.m., in the Club Room of the Social Democratic Federation, back of 19, Wharf Street (opposite the "Gaiety"), to consider the advisability of forming a "Labour Club and Institute." As no arrangements of any kind whatever have, as yet, been made, it is absolutely necessary that all who are sufficiently interested in the cause of Labour to be prepared to take part in this movement should attend this first meeting; and it is hoped that all those into whose hands this circular may come will accept it as a cordial invitation to be present.

An Institution of the kind proposed would not attract those who desire in a club simply Drink and a comic song, but it would be a meeting place, and could provide literature dealing with the social problems we have to grapple with, for those who recognize the existence of the Class War between Monopolists and Workers, and are prepared to fight on the side of Labour.

An educational centre for the Labour movement is an absolute necessity of the times, and it would be the main object of such a Club to form a "brain" for the local working-class movement, in order that ignorance and prejudice may be dispelled, and such information and ideals placed prominently before the people, that the conception of life may be elevated and the rights and duties of the Workers made clearer.
