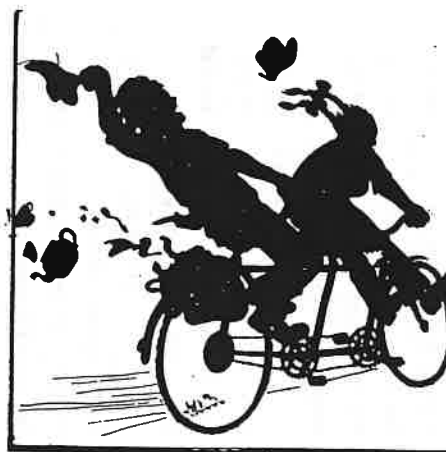

This year 1986 is the fiftieth anniversary of the Spanish Revolution and Civil War. The Kate Sharpley Library along with the anarchist publishing group ASP have republished the classic work 'THE TRAGEDY OF SPAIN' by Rudolf Rocker, it is our small tribute to the heroic Spanish people who were among the first to make a stand against the rising tide of world fascism, it is also important to republish this work which exposes the crimes of the Communist Party against the social revolution, because today once again we witness the activities of the CP and its fellow travellers in attempting to discredit the anarchist movement here in Britain. The expulsion of the anarchist Class War group from Anti-Fascist Action is only the tip of the iceberg and the present anti-anarchist hysteria which is now sweeping the British gutter press (Sunday Mirror 27/4/86, front page lead story and follow up on 4/5/86; Today 29/3/86 front page lead story) bears the hallmark of a certain type of journalism associated with the so-called anti-fascist magazine Searchlight which is controlled and run by a former Communist Party election agent.

The KSL is not and never will be an academic research centre, far removed from the struggle of our movement, we see our role as one devoted to gathering information from the movement and about the movement. Our files of press cuttings are quite extensive, but we always welcome more, especially cuttings from local papers. We shall of course be keeping a very close eye on the gutter press over the next few months. The publication of Rocker's THE TRAGEDY OF SPAIN was undertaken with the assistance of the South & East London DAM groups and contains an introduction by Terry Liddle editor of Volya, it is available from ASP, BM Hurricane, London WC1N 3XX. Price £1.20 plus P&P.

The 1980's have produced in Britain at least, a minor upsurge in anarchist journals. Below is a partial list of these publications, the KSL will refrain from passing judgement on any of them, but we must add for the record that the anarchist movement would have been better off without some of them.
